## 2. Discussion with Superintendent Finalist Candidate Jennifer Parson:

The Committee met with Jennifer Parson and discussed various topics related to her Superintendent candidacy. Ms. Parson noted that the biggest silver linings of COVID are the opportunities to slow down and educators finding the power of working with each other. She has watched several School Committee meetings and feels the Superintendent search process has been very thorough. Ms. Parson discussed her portrait of a graduate and the role of mentorship in the job of Superintendent including helping staff talk through challenging situations, brainstorming, and working with new teachers.

Ms. Parson noted the importance of clear communication and messaging. She emphasized that at the end of the day the Superintendent needs to look at how a decision will impact the students. Once a decision is made, it is important to get the information to stakeholders. Things that could be addressed in Wayland include communication, facilities/space constraints, ensuring equity and access, and experiencing learning in a productive way.

Ms. Parson has been involved in several building projects over her career. Regarding staff morale, she noted that staff need to know they are being heard. Ms. Parson has been inspired by her current superintendent's ability to balance the work, being non-judgmental, and an unbridled passion for education. Regarding nurturing self-confident, collaborative and conscientious students, Ms. Parson noted the importance of finding ways to highlight value through programs, how people speak to each other, and teacher responses.

Jennifer Parson left the meeting.
